On the terrace side their presence was made known in the favours displayed here and there, while when Dewsbury took the field the support was still more evident in the cheering which took place. Taking all circumstances into consideration we are inclined to regard the attendance of between 10,000 and 11,000 as good. Fortunately the day was fine, and when the teams took the field conditions were ideal for the game. Dewsbury made one change from the previous week, in that Hirst replaced Thomas at full-back.

On our part Talbot came in for Norcliffe in the second row of the pack, and Bowkett was Markham's centre in place of Parker, who had not fully recovered from a cold.

the League match, Dewsbury were 8 points behind at an early stage. The forceful display of our forwards had contributed, in no small degree, to our success. Already there had been a big improvement noticeable upon the previous week, particularly in the open. We were still seeing Dewsbury mostly in possession from the 'scrums,' but lack of speed prevented their backs from forcing home the advantage. It almost seemed that if our line was to be crossed in this half it would be the result of a defensive lapse rather than from Dewsbury's ability to successfully round off their attacks. On one occasion danger did threaten, due to uncertainty in dealing with a long kick, but, fortunately, a clearance was affected in time. The visiting team at length opened their account by means of a penalty goal, kicked by Hirst after Talbot had played the ball when obviously off-side. Play was mostly in our half for a time, and just when our role was taken up in defence we turned the tables in sensational fashion. Brogden nipped in among the Dewsbury backs, took the ball, and ran up the field. He then passed to Bowkett, who made further ground, and when hampered managed to get in a high pass to Markham. OUR OWN "SPOT OF BOTHER."

While fully recognising that a visit to Barrow will call for a great effort on our part, there is no need to be over awed in visualising the task.
