There is one little item of information that may help to sustain interest during the remainder of our programme this month. It lies in the fact that if we win up in our last three games (including to-day) we shall come within one point of last season's aggregate, when the total was 42. Bramley resulting in a draw. Last season a drawn game was not experienced in our League programme. As to a comparison of final placings, this season with last, assuming we win up to the end, the position cannot yet be clearly defined. In season 1932-33 our League placing was 9th from the top. At the moment we are 13th, but a successful finish is sure to mean a rise of a few places in the League.

As to how our final position will affect the regulated order of our Lancashire programme for 1934-35, that, again, is uncertain at present. Last season, as 4th Yorkshire Club in the Rugby League table, we have this season had to play Nos. 1, 4, 6, 7, 11 and 12 of the Lancashire Clubs, which were Salford, Warrington, St. Helen's, Widnes, the 'Recs' and Halifax.

There is a possibility of some alteration in the existing formula being brought about ere the start of next season, while the position of Halifax, as a Lancashire club, may be affected, at any rate to the extent of the 'Blue and White's' choice of Yorkshire fixtures. We shall have to 'wait and see' what the future has in store.

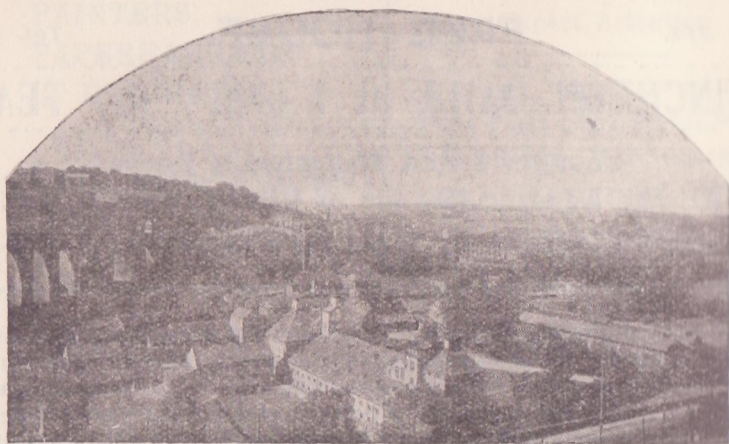

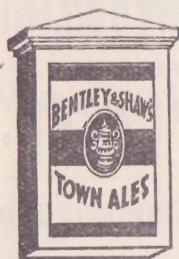

Let it be stated, also, that our action was not the outcome of a quarrel with the ex-Bradford N. player, nor he with us. The plain truth is we felt that a 'parting of the ways' would be found mutually satisfactory, and this outlook became the basis for effecting the transfer. We wish our ex-Fartown International centre a long and happy association with our Headingley friends. As to the transfer fee received by us, well—it is of a very substantial nature. Bradford N. received a high figure from us when we secured Brogden from them, and on top of this we were early called upon to bear the heavy expense attendant upon our new player being placed in the hands of the late

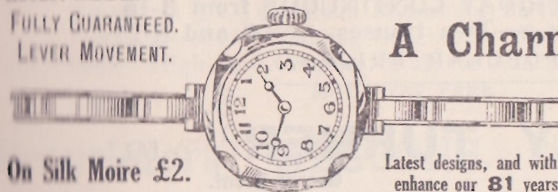

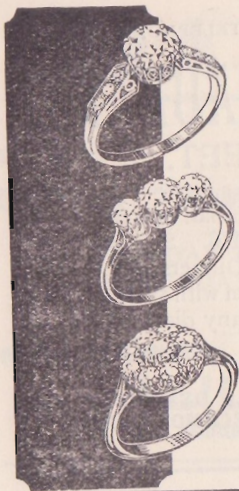
