OFFICIAL NOTES

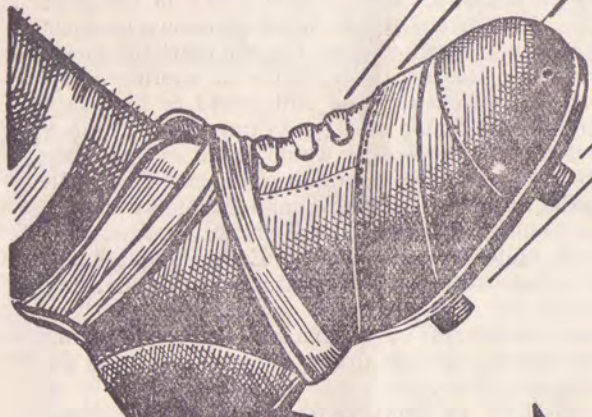

Fiddes sustained an arm injury just before half-time, and afterwards played on the wing, though little more than a 'passenger.' Later in the game Pepperell had to go off for attention to a nasty cut over the eye, while Scourfield was badly shaken in a tackle, Senior was also 'groggy' for a time. It was against this weakened opposition that Oliver opened the second half scoring with two splendid penalty goals. 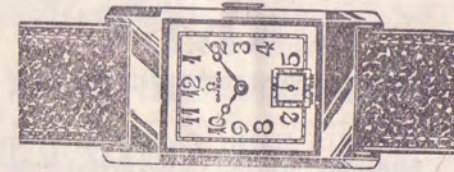

our own hopes were correspondingly raised.
