OFFICIAL NOTES.

Both sides had notable absentees, due to a variety of causes. On our part we had to find substitutes for Scourfield, the two Pepperells, Gray, Johnson and Chadwick. The last named, loaned to us from Northern a few weeks ago, had to don the visiting club's colours to make up their full complement of forwards. The England v. Wales match at Oldham, the same afternoon, reduced Northern's strength, with Walters, Foster, Whitcombe and Moores being engaged.

Unfortunately too, we struck bad weather which considerably reduced the expected large attendance.

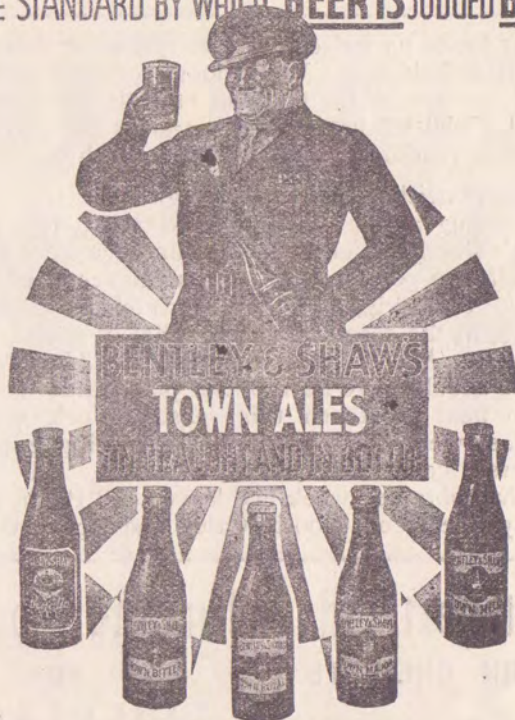

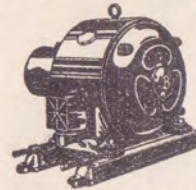

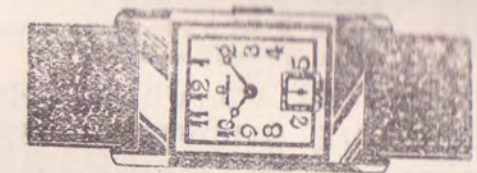

- (1)—Huddersfield last finished at the top of the Rugby League table in season 1931-32, when they had 61 points against 60 by St. Helens who came second. The "Saints" won the League play off final against us by 9 points to 5. The match was played at Wakefield.
- (2)—Huddersfield lost 5 matches at home (and only 6 away) during season 1939-40. The home games lost were against Hull, Halifax, Bradford Northern, Hull Kingston Rovers and Dewsbury.
- (3)—"Waggy" played 9 times for England v. Australia, a record not approached by any other Fartowner.
- (4)—Scourfield, Markham, Richards, Sherwood, Tiffany and Talbot played for Huddersfield in both Wembley Cup Finals. Adams and Dai Davies each appeared once for and once against Huddersfield in these two finals.

E." was transferred to Batley on January 6th, 1928. It was A. E. Fisher who played for Fartown in the Yorkshire Cup Final, at Wakefield, on 28th Nov., 1925.

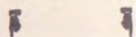

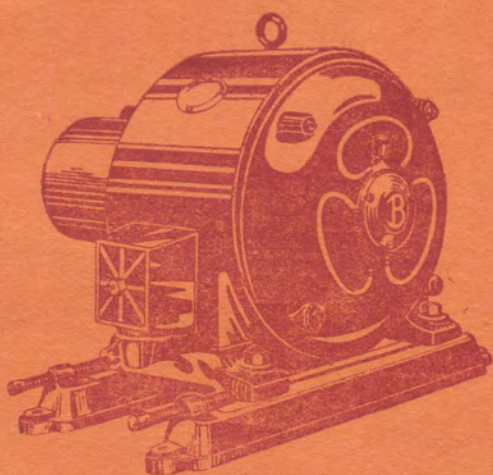
