OFFICIAL NOTES

A few weeks ago, in an earlier programme, we had to record, with deep regret, the untimely death, while on active service, of Herbert Sherwood, one of the best liked and valued of Fartown players who ever donned the "claret and gold" jersey. At the same time we announced our intention of honouring a promise, made to Sherwood before the outbreak of war, that we would grant him a Benefit match in recognition of his long and faithful service.

To-day we assemble at Fartown for the fulfilment of that promise. Had Herbert Sherwood lived to take part in his Benefit match, we know his first thoughts in accepting the proceeds would have been towards his wife and child. And so to-day, in remembering our old forward, we shall do what he himself would have done, i.e., hand over the whole of the proceeds, in due course, to Mrs. Sherwood for herself and child.

In helping to make this match possible we are grateful to Mr. John Wilson (R.L. Secretary) and Mr. Jack Walkington of Hunslet, for their kindly and successful efforts in raising an attractive team to oppose us to-day. To our own players, including our guest members, and to the visiting side, "A Rugby League Team," we do tender our warmest thanks. Many thanks too, to those friends who have given subscriptions and purchased tickets.

Granted favourable weather, we are hopeful the sum raised before the match will be considerably augmented by the actual turnstile receipts, and that the sum total will be worthy of the memory of a great Fartowner who gave his life for his country.

We are indebted to our old friend, "A Fartown Enthusiast," for a few statistics concerning Sherwood's doings while in our 1st team. He played in 432 games; he kicked 187 goals and scored 25 tries, a total of 449 points. Only Douglas Clark and Harold Wagstaff played in more 1st team matches. Sherwood played 5 times for Yorkshire and was Reserve for England in season 1934-5.
