OFFICIAL NOTES

Today it is our privilege and pleasure to entertain our New Zealand visitors, and on behalf of all the officials, players and followers of the Huddersfield Cricket and Athletic Club we extend to the Kiwis a very warm welcome to Fartown. Before today's game the New Zealanders will be received by the Mayor of Huddersfield (Councillor G. B. Jones) at the Town Hall, and this evening they will be the guests of our President, Mr. H. V. Wood, and the Football Committee at a Celebration Dinner to be held at the Albany Hall.

Since the Rugby League (then Northern Union) was formed in Huddersfield fifty-six years ago the code has had its ups and downs. Yet to the true rugby-lover it remains, when properly played, as the best game of them all. New Zealanders have always favoured the open, attacking game so we confidently look for an enjoy-

able exposition of Rugby League football today, for that is the style which is favoured at Fartown.

The 1951 Kiwis did not make a very impressive beginning to their Tour, but they showed their great potentialities in the Odsal Test last Saturday. Although beaten 21-15 they went down gallantly and many of those present were of the opinion that Great Britain were fortunate to win. Be that as it may, the fact remains that the home team **did** win and we at Fartown found particular satisfaction in the reports on the play of Dick Cracknell, who celebrated his Test debut with a try.

So, once again, a hearty welcome to Huddersfield and to Fartown, Kiwis. Your stay among us will be brief but we trust it will be very enjoyable and that you will take the happiest of memories away with you.

The 1951 Kiwis are the fifth team from New Zealand to play at Fartown. Here are details of our previous matches against visitors from the Dominion.

January 9th, 1889

The Maoris won by 2 goals, 1 try, 4 minors, to 2 goals, 1 minor. The Huddersfield goals were both kicked by Fred Richmond—one from a penalty and one

from a try by Wilson Schofield. Converted tries were counted as goals in those days. For this game the Fartowners had the assistance of 3 players from other clubs.

Attendance 8,130. Receipts £406/10/0. New Zealand won 19-8, their tries being scored by Lance Todd 2, Wright, Rcw and Byrne. Edgar Wrigley kicked the two goals. Sykes and Bartholomew scored the Fartown tries while Holroyd kicked the goal.

Several of the Tourists later returned to play with English clubs. Edgar Wrigley (who still lives in Huddersfield) came to Fartown, as did Trevarthen and Con Byrne, while others were Turtill (St. Helens), Smith (Oldham) and Todd (Wigan and Dewsbury). Lance Todd, who was killed in a war-time road accident, became manager at Salford after his playing days ended.

The Cracknell who played in our forwards is the father of our present wingman, while Henry Tiffany who was at loose-forward is now our assistant trainer.

Another Fartown victory, this time by 12 points to 7. Bawden and Morgan scored our tries, Bawden adding three goals. Anderson scored the Tourists' try and Warwick Clarke kicked two goals. Heavy rain before and during the match affected the attendance and the ground conditions but did not prevent both teams from playing good football.

The 1939 Kiwis were due to play at Fartown on October 18th of that year but the Tour had to be abandoned owing to the outbreak of war and the New Zealanders returned home after playing only two matches—at St. Helens and Dewsbury.

So much for the past—now back to the present. May today's game be voted the "best ever."

player way back in 1918 when he lived in Canterbury and later became a referee. He then moved across the South Island to West Coast, where he became R.L. Secretary, a post he has filled with great credit for the last eight years.

Mr. Wilkie has done a great deal of administrative work in Auckland during the past 25 years. Three years ago he was appointed a Trustee and the Chairman of the Auckland Board of Control. His work in this capacity has been responsible for many improvements in playing and public conditions at Auckland's Test Match Ground, Carlaw Park.

The team coach, Mr. T. A. (Scotty) McClymont, came over here with the 1947 Kiwis. "Scotty" played for New Zealand against England in his younger days and in recent years has been acknowledged as one of the best coaches in the country.
