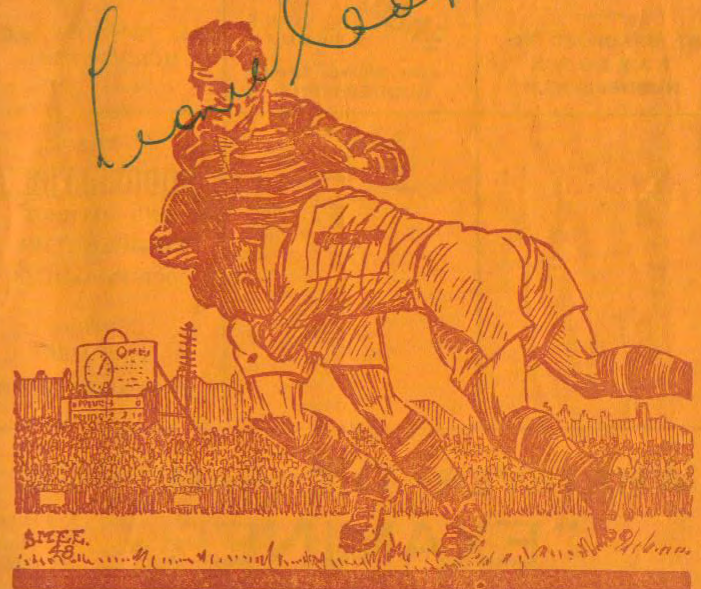

OFFICIAL NOTES

A warm welcome to Wakefield Trinity on their visit to Fartown this afternoon. As Yorkshire Challenge Cup-holders, we shall be defending the Trophy this season, and judging on cup repute we couldn't have been given a much harder first round task. Trinity won the Cup at Fartown in 1951 — many of us will remember their final 17-3 victory over Keighley on that occasion—and they have, indeed, a fine record in the Competition.

Trinity started the present season with a couple of good wins, but then lost at home to Leigh and away to Belle Vue Rangers. The latter was rather a surprise, for Trinity were beaten pointlessly and they provided the Rangers with their first victory of the season.

However, League form usually counts for little in Cup football, and though we have ground advantage today we must remember that the right of entry into the

second round does not depend on today's score alone. With a visit to Belle Vue for next Wednesday's "second leg" in prospect our aim must be to build up a useful lead.

Our New Player

As announced recently in the Press we have signed David McMurray Rose, the Scottish International three-quarter. Rose played his first International before his nineteenth birthday, against France at Colombes Stadium, in January, 1951, and has been capped seven times for Scotland. In addition he has played for the R.A.F. in the big Services' Representative games. His international football has been played on the left wing, but he prefers centre and has occupied that position in club games.

Rose, who played his first senior football with Jedforest at the age of sixteen, is now 22 years old. He stands 5ft. 11½ins. and weighs 12½ stone. We welcome him

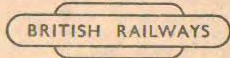
