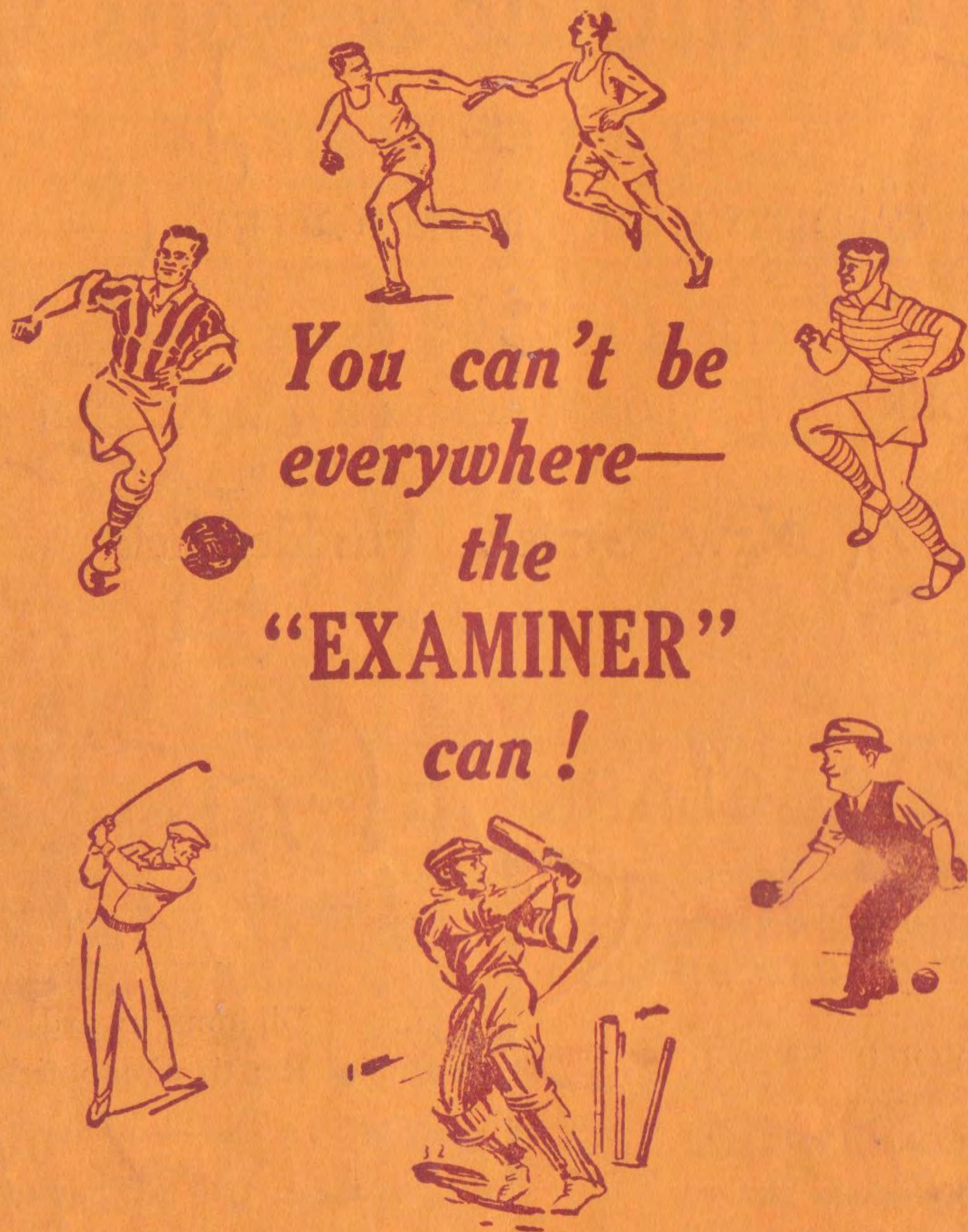

OFFICIAL NOTES

After a few days breathing space Castleford and ourselves are ready to start the second attempt to decide which team goes forward to the Rugby League Challenge Cup Semi-Final.

We are hoping that, with ground advantage this time, we shall be able to do the trick, but Castleford showed us on Saturday that they are not going to be easy to beat. In the first half hour at Wheldon Road we seemed to be well on top without being able to turn our advantage into tries.

A couple of penalty goals by Frank Dyson (who also hit the upright with another shot) were all we had to show, and by half-time Albert Lunn had made the score 4-4.

Neither side could score a try, owing to the stern defensive play and to attacking mistakes, but it is to the credit of both teams that despite the closeness of the

scores and the fierceness of the struggle the game was free from incidents. We hope that today's replay will be played out in a similar sporting fashion.

We extend a warm welcome to the Castleford party and to their supporters, of whom we anticipate there will be quite a few here this evening. A special word of congratulation too, to the Castleford centre Peter Small, who will accompany Ken Noble on the Tour to Australia this summer.

In Albert Lunn, Castleford have an experienced full-back and an accurate goal-kicker who will not have to be given many opportunities. Alongside Small in the centre is the strong-running Geoff Ward, and between them they will be making the running for wingers Bryant and Marsden if given half a chance.

absence of Hirst and Tonkinson the pack, which is well led by former centre John Sheridan, showed on Saturday that it can give a good account of itself.

The first R.L. Cup-tie between Huddersfield and Castleford was at Wheldon Road in 1929. "Cas" won 8-0 and the game was Douglas Clark's last in the Fartown jersey.

Then came the 1935 Wembley Final. That was Castleford's big day, for they beat us by 11 points to 8. Their Wembley team included such well-remembered names as Arthur Atkinson, Jim Croston, Les Adams (who had won a Cup medal with us two years earlier) and Ted Sadler.

In our 1953 Wembley year we played Castleford in the first round. They were two-leg affairs at that time and we won both games by 36-14 at Fartown and 6-2 at Wheldon Road.

One other cup meeting is worth recalling because of its unique finish. It was a Yorkshire Cup-tie at Fartown in 1941, and

at the end of the game the scores were level at 3 points each.

Extra time could not be played as many of the Castleford players had to report for various duties in connection with the war effort, so our players lined up with no opposition facing them. Alec Fiddes kicked off and Billy Belshaw scored a try which he also converted.

That made the score 8-3 and at a special meeting of the Yorkshire County Committee we were awarded the tie. This unusual ending was, of course, brought about by the exigencies of war-time football and could not happen in peace-time.

And so we come back to tonight's game. We hope it is free from injuries, and worthy of the occasion.

For Castleford, Clark comes in at prop, as Berry broke a bone in his hand on Saturday. Gwyn Davies had his injured wrist X-rayed and there is nothing broken. He hopes to be able to play.

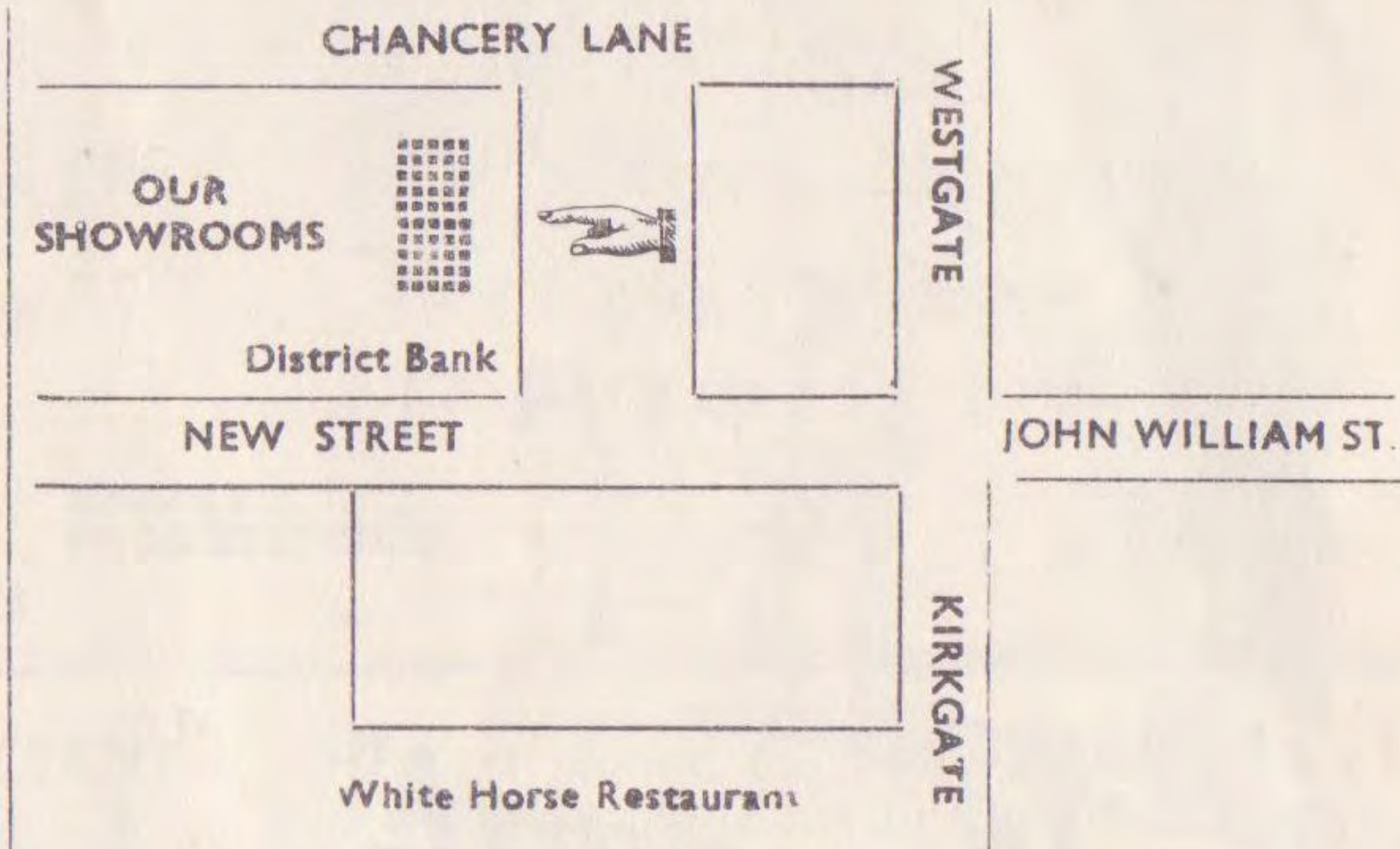

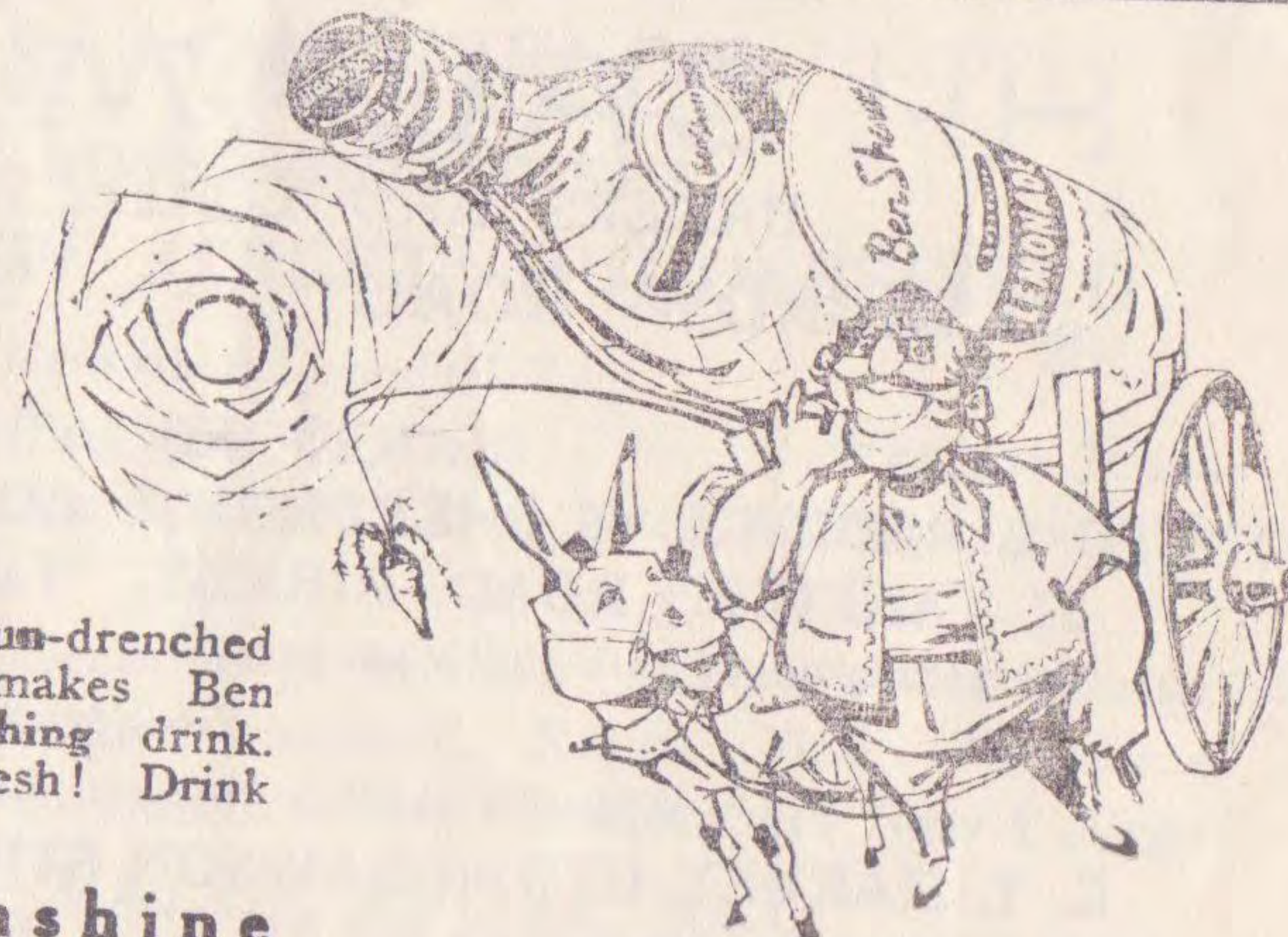

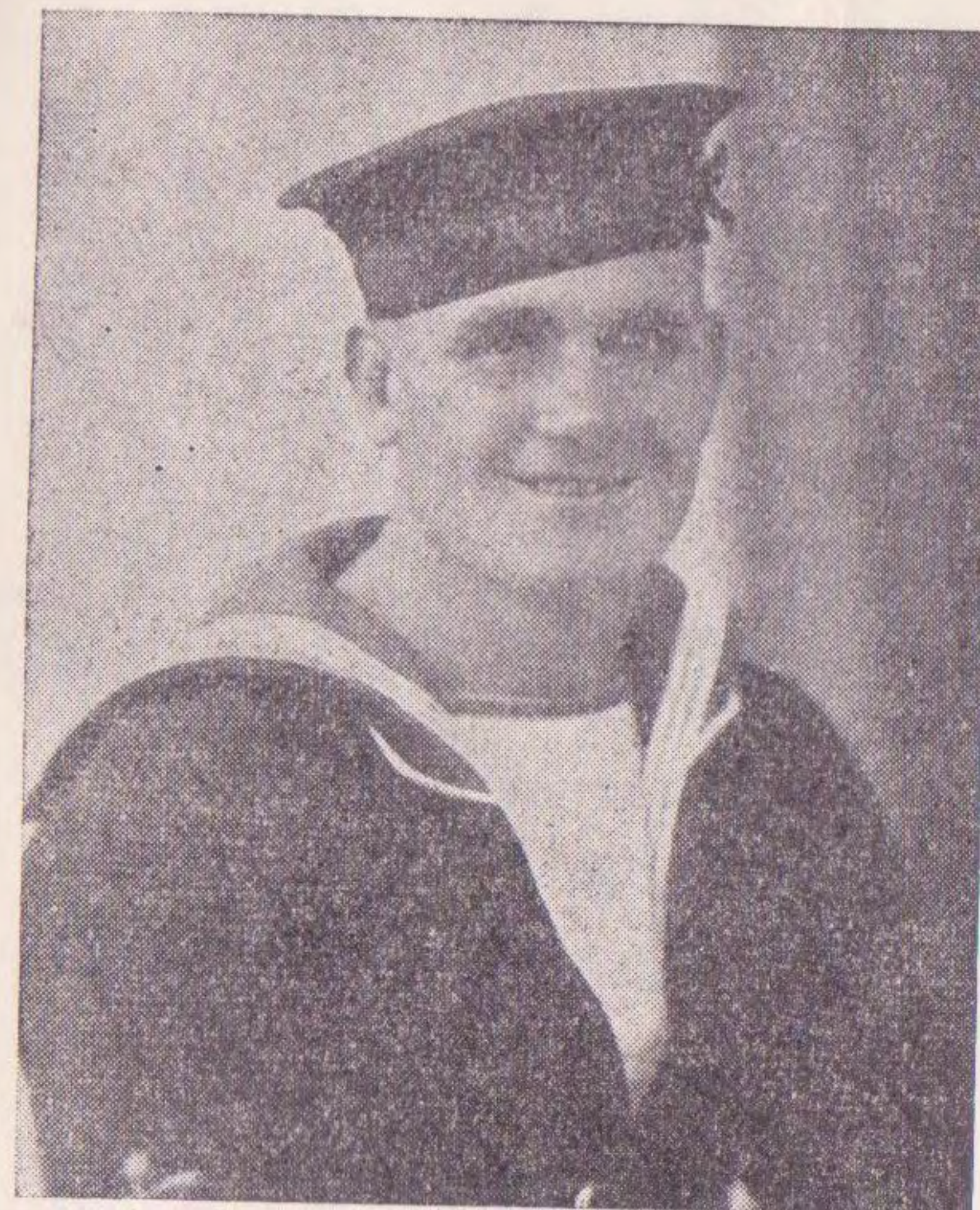

FARTOWNERS PAST AND PRESENT
No. 29 — **Herbert Sherwood**



Herbert signed for us in October 1927, and when he made his first team debut at Widnes the following February he had not had his 18th birthday. He only made a few senior appearances during his first three seasons, but once he became established as a prop forward in the first team he was rarely absent from the side.

He took part in both our Wembley Finals of 1933 and 1935, and also played in the 1932 League Final and two Yorkshire Cup Finals.

Herbert revealed unsuspected powers as a goal kicker during 1933, and in his very first game in this new role he kicked us to victory against Leeds, in a match which saw Ray Markham and Fred Brindle make their debuts for us.

He kicked 54 goals in 1933-34 and 71 the following season.

He played for two seasons after the out-break of war and then joined the Royal Navy. He died in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil, while on active service.

Herbert played in 432 first team games and scored 449 points (187 goals and 25 tries). He was a prominent member of the successful Fartown 7-a-side teams just before the war.
