Brian Curry has not had the best of luck since he signed for Oldham last July and has been plagued by injuries, but we hope the new year will bring him better fortune. Irving is regarded as one of the most promising young forwards in the game and has already gained Under-24 international honours.

But coming back to this season, we find that Oldham are doing fairly well in the League table. They are in the "top eight" and will be trying to keep there and thus qualify for a home game in the Championship Play-offs.

They reached the Lancashire Challenge Cup Final, only to be beaten 13-16 by Wigan at Swinton.

Hooker Kevin Taylor is their top try scorer with 9, followed by Bob Irving (8), John Donovan and Tom Warburton (7), Stan McCormack, Trevor Simms and Terry Dolly (6 each).

Despite missing many games through injury, Curry has landed 54 goals, and during his absences Warburton has taken over to land 37 goals.

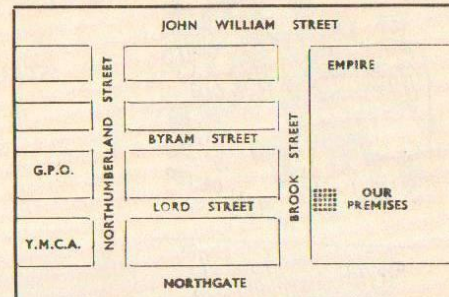

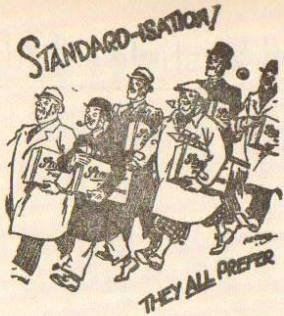

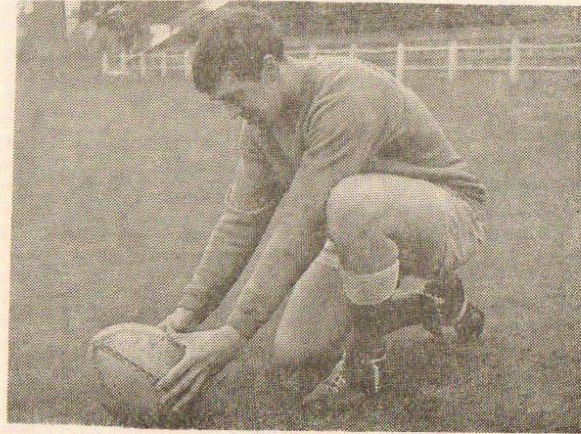
