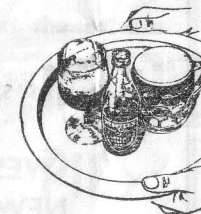

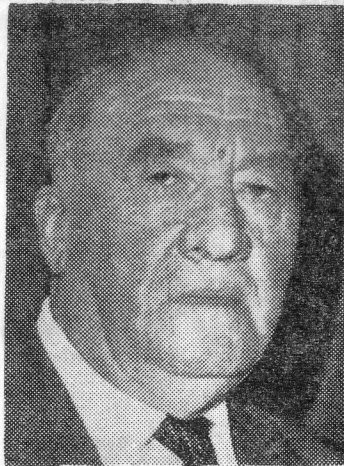

## OFFICIAL NOTES

Today sees a mile-stone in Fartown history (ground conditions permitting) with the "switch-on" of our flood-lighting system by the President of the Huddersfield Cricket and Athletic Club, Mr. Robert Hanson.

We have Hull as very welcome visitors on this important occasion, and we are only sorry that we cannot greet them as Yorkshire Cup winners after their great performance against their local rivals at Headingley last Saturday.

The Hull team put up a great defence to keep out their more fancied rivals from Craven Park for most of the game, and it must have been extremely galling to them to concede that try near the end. It gave Hull K.R. the lead for the first time during the match, and also gave them the Trophy.

The following players represented Hull in Saturday's game at Headingley —

Keegan; Oliver, Doyle-Davidson, Maloney, Stocks; Devonshire, Davidson; Harrison, McGlone, Broom, Edson, Macklin and Sykes.

Geoff Stocks is, of course, a former Fartowner. He joined us from Leeds junior football in August, 1959, and we transferred him to Hull in January, 1964. Geoff had a spell in the forwards after moving to the Boulevard but now seems to have settled down on the wing.

Arthur Keegan will be representing Great Britain against Australia in the First Test at Leeds next Saturday. He toured "down-under" with the 1966 Great Britain Tour Team, playing in two of the three Tests against Australia, and was also Great Britain's full back in both Tests against France last season.

Hull have the game's leading goal-kicker of the moment in John Maloney. A product of the famous Shaw Cross Boys' Club, Maloney is rapidly developing as

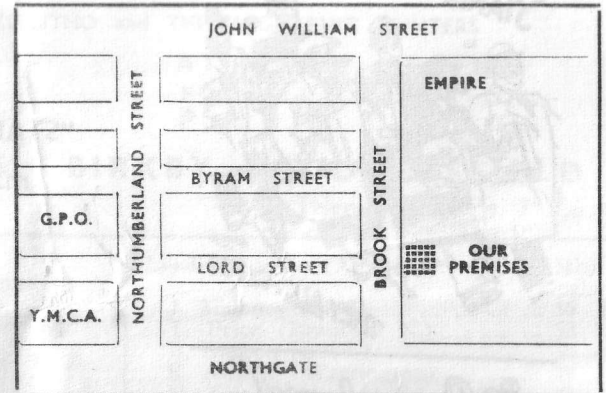
