



# ALBERT AARON ROSENFELD

*"THE WARY, NIPPERY, SLIPPERY*

*LITTLE AUSTRALIAN"*

**Albert Aaron Rosenfeld was one of the remarkable players in the first Australian party that embarked on the 1909 tour of England.**

His talents were instantly recognised by the Huddersfield officials who signed him to join the Claret and Golds after he had finished the tour, and they couldn't have made a better move.

An injury in his first practice match at Fartown had kept him out of the opening game at Bramley, but he recovered to play right-wing three-quarter in the first home fixture against Broughton Rangers on September 11th 1909, even scoring a couple of impressive tries.

In his career with the Fartown club "Rozzy" was a member of The Team of All Talents who destroyed all Fartown's record books in a breath-taking 1914-1915 season. He was part of the team that gained 6 Yorkshire Cup wins, 5 Yorkshire League titles and 3 Championship cups. He created a world record 63 tries in 33 league games, and in the 1913-14 season he had scored a record breaking 80 tries.

In the 100 years of Rugby League Football at Huddersfield only a dozen players have passed the half-a-century of tries in one season. Rosenfeld reached this target in four successive seasons.

Not for nothing was Albert Aaron Rosenfeld described as "the wary, nippery, slippery little Australian". He certainly made his mark with the Fartowners and will always be remembered as one of the greatest wingers to have ever played Northern Union Football.
