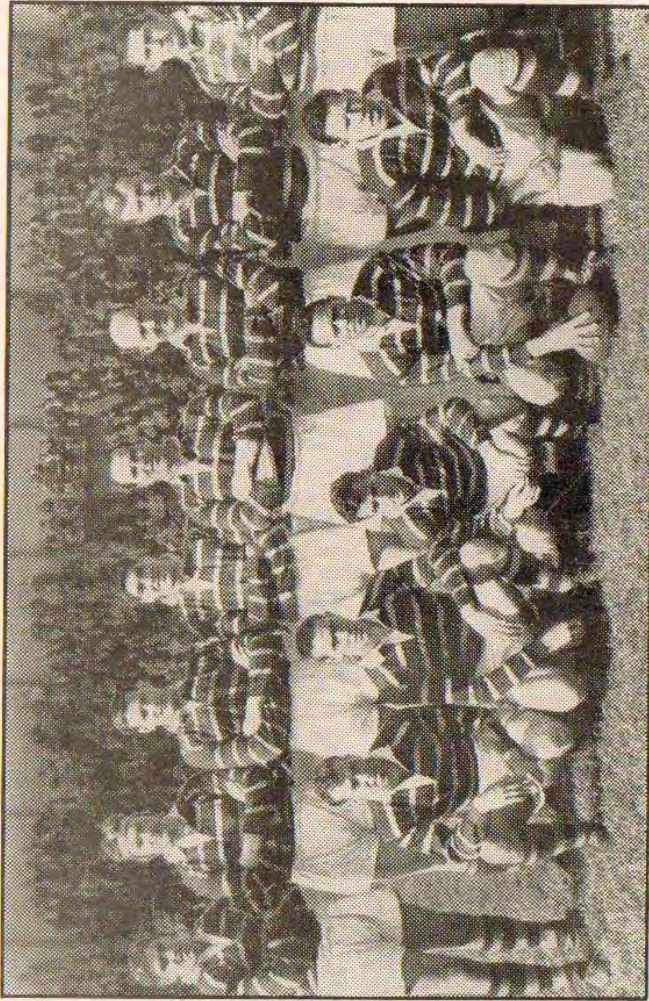

Following the departure of Ernie Ashcroft, Dave Valentine has been appointed coach and chief scout for the club. Valentine first played for us in October, 1947 — his debut being at Dewsbury — and played a great part in our triumphs of the late 1940's and early 1950's. A succession of injuries — he broke a leg on three occasions — kept him out of the game for a period (during which time he coached Bramley).

Last season Dave made a come-back, and after only one "A" team game he turned out in the Yorkshire Challenge Cup Final. In that as in subsequent games, he surprised the critics by his ability to stay the pace.

It may be that Dave will not be called upon to play this season, but he will be available if needed.

In Retrospect

BY finishing in a slightly lower League position than they held at the end of the previous season, it may be said that the team disappointed us during 1960-61. So they did — on several occasions — and yet there were many times when they showed us just how capable they were of better things.

There were the Yorkshire Cup-ties, notably the semi-final and Final, the "shock" win at Belle Vue, the defeat of Halifax (then a Top Four club) at Fartown and the rousing victories against Leeds and Wakefield Trinity at Fartown, to mention but a few of the highlights. It was difficult to believe that the same players, in the main, could show such a reversal of form as they did in games like those against Keighley, Batley and Widnes at Fartown.

The season saw the end of Ernie Ashcroft's Fartown career, for he has taken up an appointment at Warrington as successor to Ces Mountford. We shall, of course, be coming across Ernie at least twice during the new-season, and all Fartowners will join us in wishing him "all the best" at Wilderspool.

The setting up by Frank Dyson of a new aggregate club goal record and the return to the team of Dave Valentine after three years' absence were interesting features. "Val" had only one "A" team appearance before he took over his old role as loose forward in the Yorkshire Cup Final — a game from which the Fartowners emerged with a great deal of credit, even though without the Cup.

Ted Slevin continued his remarkable run of appearances. He missed only one game all season and brought his number of Fartown first team appearances up to 396. Others who were rarely absent from the side were Frank Dyson, Tommy Smales, Ernie Ashcroft, Ken Noble and Ken Bowman. Don Devereux was also a regular until January, when he went on a Training Course in connection with his teaching career.

Several young players were among those who made their debuts last season with both the first and "A" teams. We hope they will have plenty of further opportunities during the coming months.

What of season 1961-62? Now that we are in the Lancashire League it seems to be the generally accepted opinion that we shall come against stiffer opposition. We feel sure that our players will accept this challenge, and we remember how frequently last season they gave of their best against the leading teams.

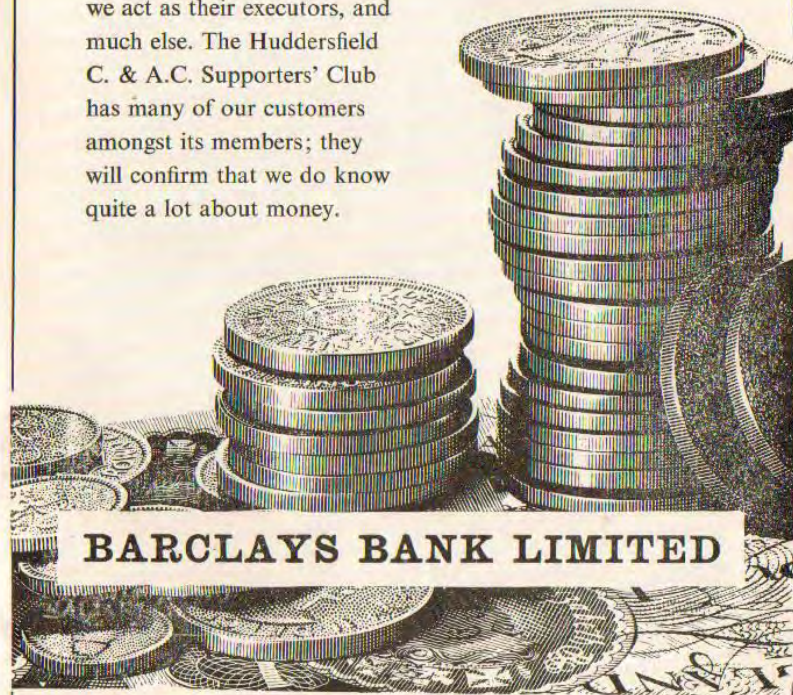

Difficulty was experienced in fitting the boys up with togs, but they were so keen that most of them bought their own jerseys rather than miss the chance of playing.

That is the spirit of enthusiasm we are trying to foster. We feel that Fartown will reap a great benefit in the years to come.

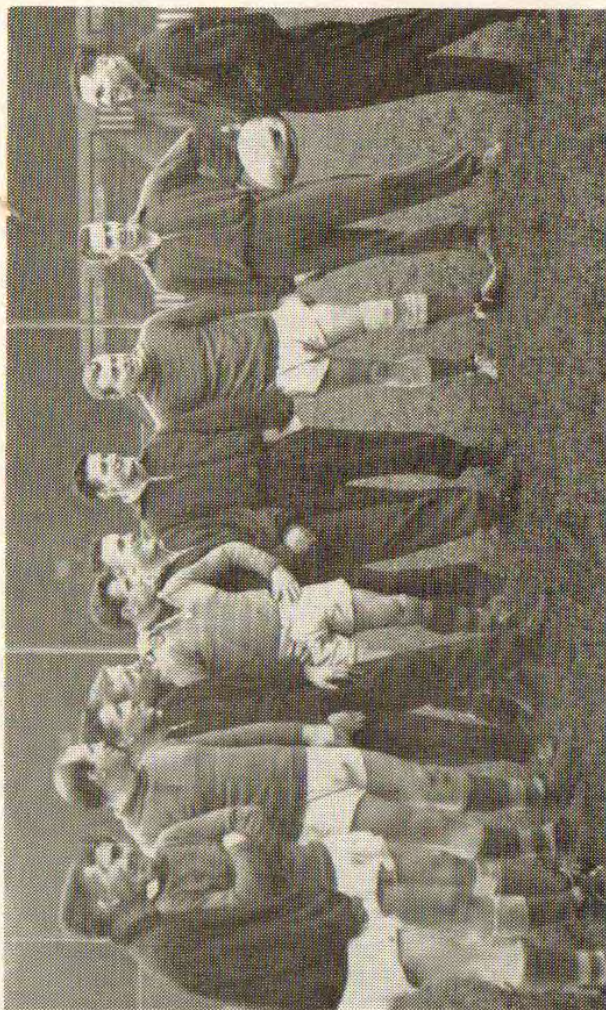

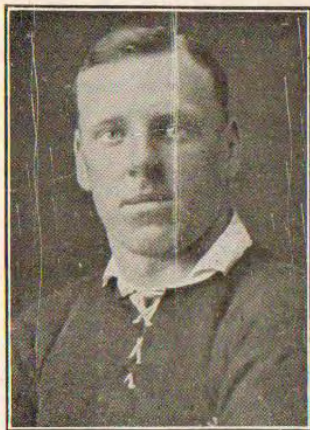

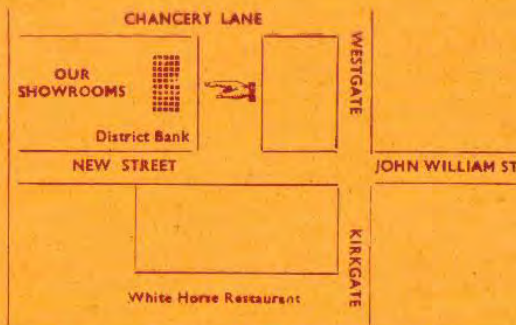
