William Cunningham — An Appreciation

I am glad to have the opportunity of writing this appreciation of Mr. William Cunningham. His outstanding qualities are courage, shrewdness and industry. He has never flinched from advocating any policy which he believed to be right, notwithstanding the strength of the opposition or the apparent unpopularity of the policy. He has all the native shrewdness of his Scottish forebears.

His work for Fartown and the Rugby League has been untiring and distinguished. He was one of the chief architects of the period 1947-1953 at Fartown when one of the finest teams we ever had was built up. Indeed it may truthfully be said of him as Mark Antony said of Caesar, "He hath brought many captives home to Rome, whose ransoms did the public coffers fill."

William Cunningham did indeed assist in bringing many of the world's most famous players to Fartown in that period, whose crowd drawing powers gave us one of the best financial results in our history. One has only to observe the way in which he is received on opponents' grounds to realise in what high regard he is held by other clubs.

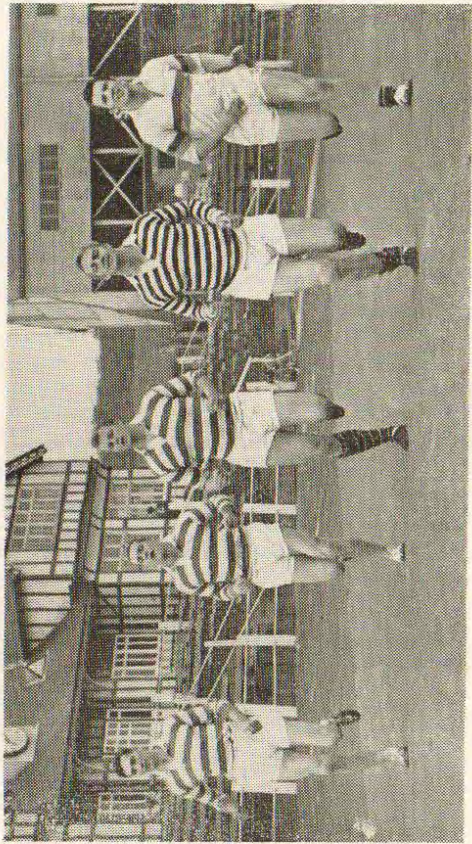
To me, personally, during my presidency, he has been the essence of kindness and helpfulness. He has unreservedly placed at my disposal his vast knowledge of Rugby League matters.

A TRAINING RUN

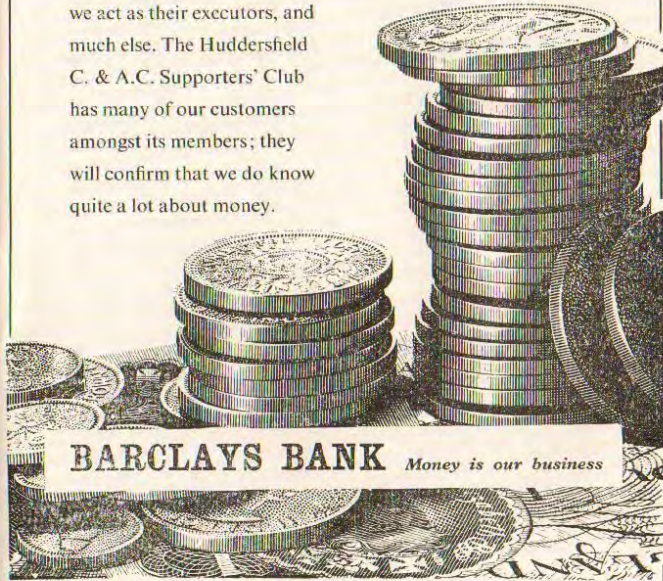

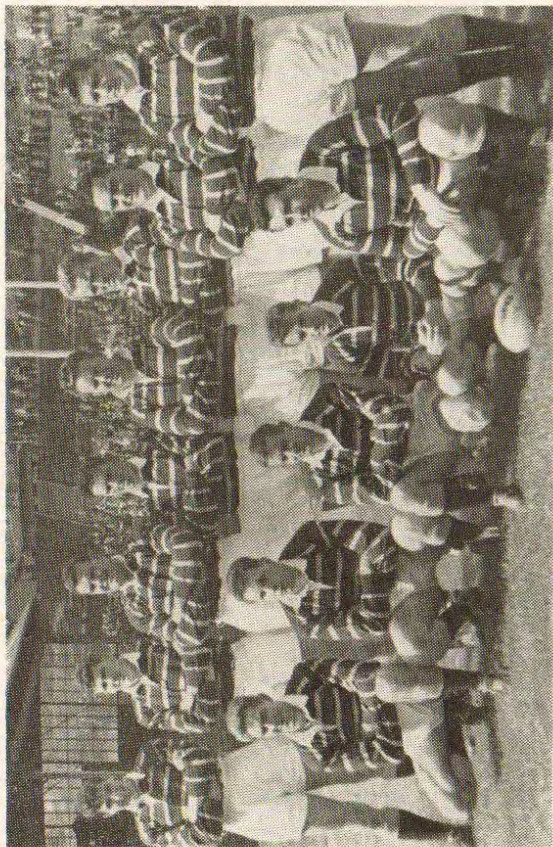

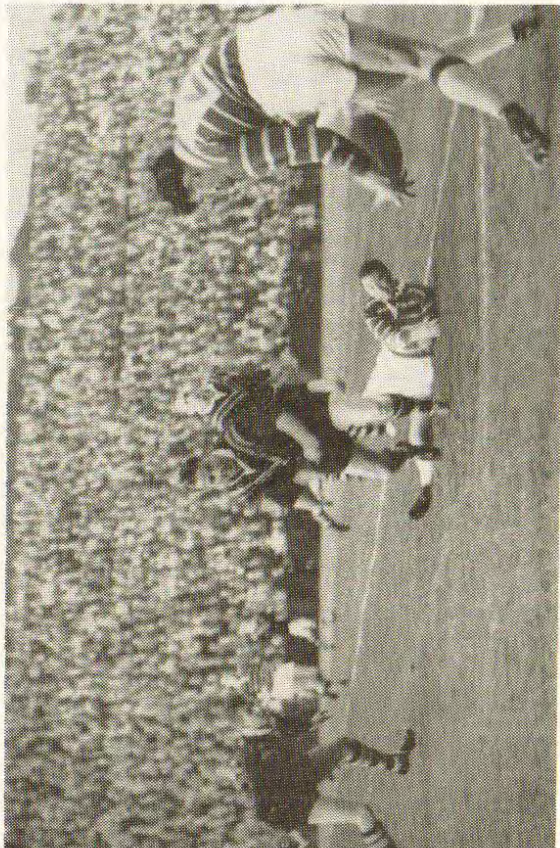

At Headingley, on Friday, August 7th, the Fartowners reached the Final, only to be beaten 7-16 by Bradford Northern. Following a bye in the first round, Wakefield Trinity were beaten 11-10 in round two, and Hunslet by 6 points to 5 in the semi-final. The Fartown team was Ford, Senior, Thompson, Smales, Anderson, Close and Bowman.

The respective attendances were 9,723 at Wigan and 9,100 at Leeds.

In Brief

Trainer Mel Meek left the club in October, when he removed to Bispham where he intended to go into private practice as a masseur. Mel joined Halifax from Newport R.U. in 1934 and was transferred to us in March, 1948. He retired as a player in August, 1950.

Ken Noble, who emigrated to Australia last November signed for the Balmain club in Sydney.

Two links with the early days of the Northern Union were broken by the deaths of Mr. Milford Sutcliffe on January 15th and Mr. Albert Pearson on May 4th. Both played in our first N.U. game in September, 1893, and Mr. Pearson scored our first try. Mr. Sutcliffe later became a member of the Football Committee and was subsequently a vice-president and a life-member of the club.

Other former Fartown players whose deaths have occurred this year are Wimpenny Brook, Donald Jessop and Jim Regan.

Five Fartowners—John Anderson, Alistair Ford, Jim Russell, Bob Valentine and Ian Van Bellen—played in Halifax Seven-a-side Tournament on May 30th. Anderson and Van Bellen played in the Final.

At the above event, Brian Curry won the Goal-kicking Competition against such stars as Neil Fox, Garfield Owen and Ron James.

A big improvement was made to the Fartown main entrance last season by the surfacing of the Drive and the provision of an Officials' Car Park alongside the Cricket Stand.

Tommy Smales joined such illustrious names as Harold Wagstaff, Gwynne Thomas and Dave Valentine when he became the fourth Fartowner to captain the Gt. Britain Test Team.

Albert Rosenfeld and his wife had a trip to Australia as part of their Golden Wedding Celebrations earlier this year. This was "Rozzy's" first visit back home since he came to play for us in 1909 and he was very impressed with the present Rugby League set-up in Sydney.

Mr. Hubert Lockwood will take Mr. Cunningham's place as Huddersfield's representative on the Rugby League Council.

Arrangements for the game went very well, and at the end of the season Fartown was also chosen as the venue for the Eastern Region Championship Final. This game had not the same "pulling power" and 10,679 people paid £1756 to see Halifax's 20-12 win over Castleford.

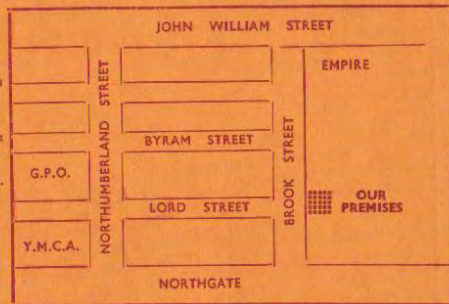
