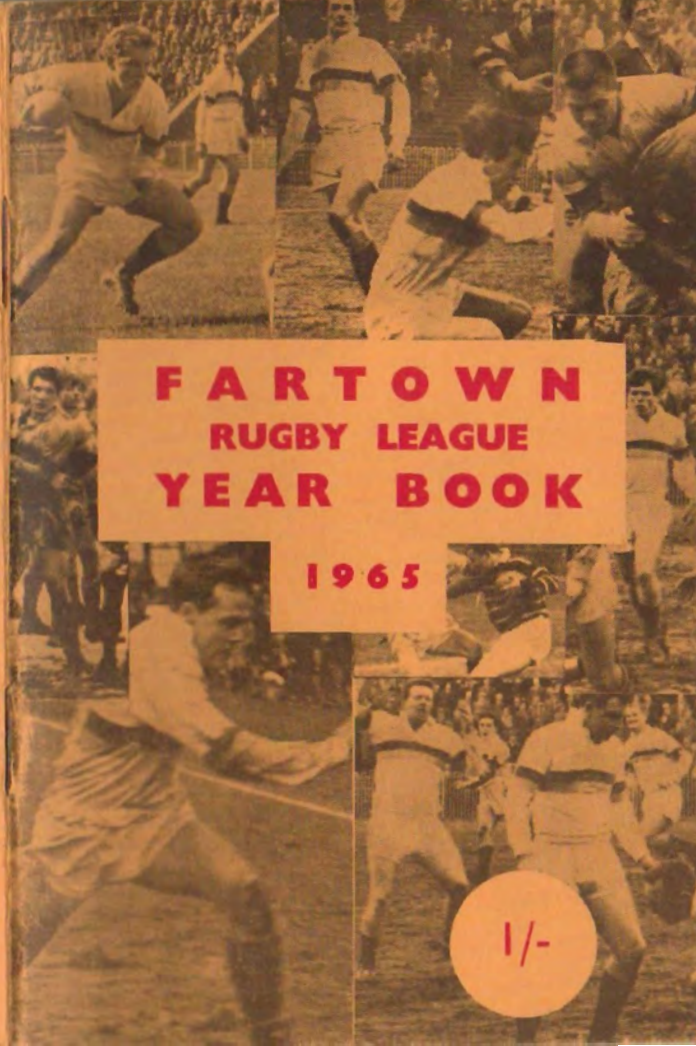

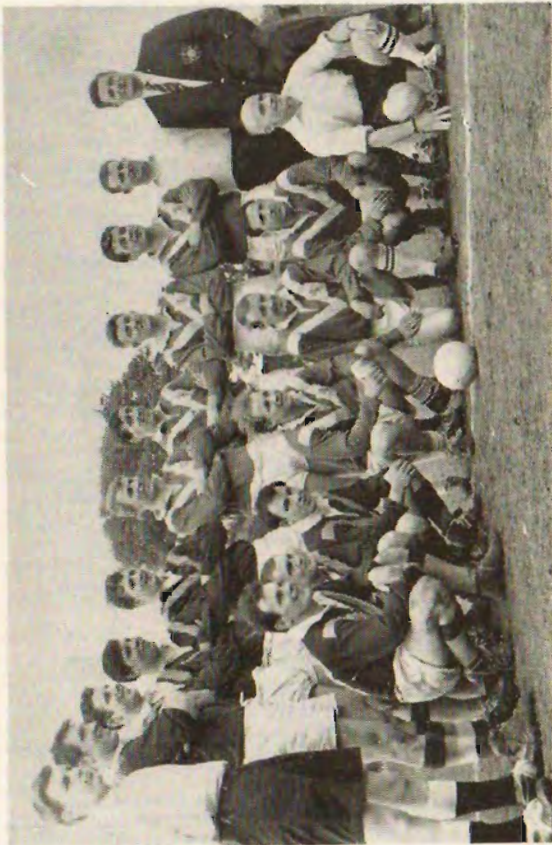

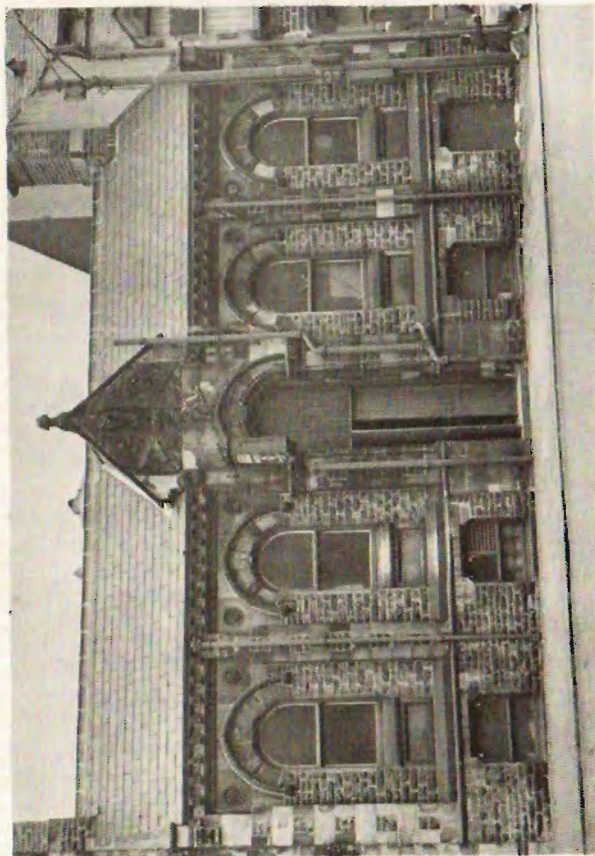

A Century of Huddersfield Sport

One hundred years ago last November a group of Huddersfield sportsmen formed the Huddersfield Athletic Club at a meeting in the Queen Hotel and thus laid the foundation for the organisation we know today as the Huddersfield Cricket and Athletic Club.

Although Rugby League football is now the major interest, a wide range of sporting activities has been covered over the years, and very many people have derived a great deal of pleasure, whether as participants or as spectators.

The first of the famous Athletic Festivals—known as the Ascot of the North—was held in 1865 at the Rifle Fields, and in the following year there is a record of football matches being played. Amalgamation with the St. John's Cricket Club took place in 1876 and a couple of years later the first football match was played at Fartown, the visitors being Manchester Rangers. The headquarters of the club at this time was the Gymnasium in St. John's Road.

Increasing interest in the club's affairs brought about extensive alterations to both cricket and football grounds in 1891, and shortly after the new season opened there was a football crowd of more than 23,000 to see Yorkshire beat Lancashire—an unusually high attendance for those days.

Troubled years followed, leading to the breakaway from the English Rugby Football Union of twenty northern clubs (including Huddersfield) and the formation of the Northern Union which, in 1922, became the Rugby Football League.

The early 1900's saw the club gradually assemble a side which many elderly followers of the game still rate as the greatest football team of all time. Under the captaincy of Harold Wagstaff they won honour after honour, culminating in the All-Four Cups season of 1914-15. And five years later, when serious football was resumed after the Great War, they showed that time had dimmed little of their brilliance.

A lean period followed, but by the 1930's another successful side had been built. Then came the war of 1939-45 and subsequently we saw yet another first-class team at Fartown, one which brought many more honours to the club.

It is the nature of fortune to fluctuate but Huddersfield people have, by and large, been very fortunate throughout the years. The club built up an outstanding reputation and a great tradition.

We are told, and with truth, that you cannot live on tradition. It is the present—what you are doing NOW—that counts. That, of course, is quite correct, but the tradition of the H.C. & A.C. should serve to inspire everyone connected with the club—officials, players and spectators alike—to seek only the best for the claret and gold.

In Brief

Following the reconstruction of the terraceside turnstiles at the Netheroyd Hill end of the ground towards the end of last season, similar work has been going on during the summer months to the turnstiles at the Scale Hill (Cowliffe) end.

It will also be noticed that great progress has been made during the close season in the building of the Supporters' Social Club and Bar.

Mr. Tom Matthewman has been elected president of the Yorkshire County Rugby League. A well-known sprinter in his younger days, Tom was the English champion at 100 yards and 220 yards, in 1924, when he took part in the Olympic games in Paris.

Mr. John H. Raynor, a member of the General Committee of the H.C. & A.C. and a vice-president and chairman of the Supporters' Club has been elected president of the Yorkshire Federation of R.L. Supporters' Clubs.

The former Fartown and Whitehaven forward, George Killen, lost his life in fighting in the Congo during March. He had not long previously returned to England from Australia, and watched the Swinton game at Fartown during December.

The Foothall Committee suffered a loss through the death of one of its members, Mr. Norman M. Pilling, during June. Mr. Pilling was elected to the committee in 1963.

Mr. W. (Bill) Smith returns to the club this season. He will attend to the football equipment and be the masseur. A former trainer at Fartown, he resigned his previous appointment in 1957.

Mel Meek, who was our trainer during the 1962 Wembley and Championship season and had previously been an international forward both at Fartown and with Halifax, will coach Blackpool Borough this season.

The 1964 Yorkshire Cup Final was played at Fartown, Wakefield Trinity beating Leeds by 18 points to 2. The attendance was 13,754.

A secretarial change took place last October when Mr. Wilfred Slater succeeded Mr. Ken Senior as Fartown secretary. Mr. Senior went to Wigan, where he replaced another former Fartown official, Mr. Jack Wood, who had been appointed secretary of Lancashire County Cricket Club.

A Fartown "Seven" played in the Leeds Seven-a-Side Competition at Headingley on Whit Monday. They beat Wigan 11-8 during extra time in the first round and lost 5-8 to Castleford in the semi-final. The Fartown team was—Curry, Senior, Hagan, Feather, Heppleston, Close, R. Valentine. Scorers against Wigan were Feather, Valentine and Senior tries, Curry a goal. Against Castleford Senior scored the try and Curry kicked the goal. In the Final St. Helens beat Castleford.

Towards the end of last season, Ken Bowman, Ally Ford, John Anderson and Gerry Andrews all had cartilage operations.

Despite protests the result was allowed to stand in Warrington's favour.

Warrington went on to beat Widnes in the Final by 19 points to 15, the first time that any other club but Wigan had won the competition.

We knocked Wigan out in the first round by 10 points to 7, Russell scoring two tries and Curry kicking the goals.

While this is not considered a rare Rugby League feat it calls for a high degree of physical fitness and maintenance of form. Curry is, in fact, only the fifth Fartowner to go through a full season without missing a single game.

It will be noticed that Ernie Mills, our Australian right winger, completed two full seasons in succession. In all he played in 122 consecutive matches between December, 1929 and September, 1932 to set up a club record. The nearest approach to this has been a run of 77 by Ted Slevin and 70 by Stanley Pepperell, while Mills himself also passed the fifty mark at a later date.

Curry's present total, including games from the previous season is 54 in succession at the start of 1965-66. Although he didn't manage to kick goals as well as to play in every match last time there were only four occasions when he failed to figure among the scorers. No more than two players, Jimmy Hoey (Widnes) and Bill Langton (Hunslet), have played and scored in every game during a full season.

Incidentally, those of our readers with long memories will be able to spot two of our players referred to above—Mills and Halliday—in the "Flashback" Wembley photograph on another page.

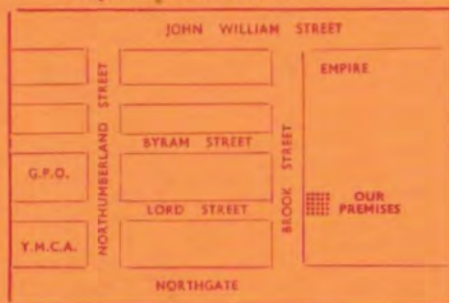
